The regional structure of the DGB

is a democratic, bottom-up structure with 8 districts and 66 regions.

The Federal Executive Board of the DGB

- on the Federal DGB Congress every four years, 400 delegates who represent all the trade unions, elect five people to their Federal Executive Board
- At the Federal DGB Congress the members take strategic decisions for the near future.

Tasks of DGB



- The DGB brings together the individual unions to work effectively.
- The DGB is the voice of the unions to the political decision-makers, parties and associations on a federal, state and municipal level.
- The role of the DGB is lobbing and mobilisation for political and social decisions.
- The DGB stands for a social solidarity. Work and income have to be distributed fairly and people must receive equal chances independent of their origin, skin colour or gender.
- The DGB offers future-oriented concepts for a social market economy which is tailored to the changes of the social conditions of today.
- Humane modernisation and fair distribution: That is what we stand for!

Tasks of the trade unions

- the unions negotiate collective agreements with the employers
- for income, working hours or holiday. In cases of labour disputes they organise strikes and pay strike support to their members.
- They help with the foundation of work councils, support employees during company conflicts and represent them during disputes with their employer.
- The union members in Germany enjoy free legal protection.





Social partnership in Germany
